These job offers for the Nord-du-Québec region taken from the are Online Placement service accessible through emploiquebec.gouv.gc.ca and from newspapers. Occupations in demand may be related to seasonality or hight labour turnover.

Building a list of occupations in demand improves our employability measures by analyzing the short-term needs of the labour market in the region. By providing a semi-annual overview of job prospects, Emploi-Québec gives businesses the opportunity to fill their vacant positions as soon as possible.

Employment Projections for the Region

According to Emploi-Québec's projections, **10,100 jobs** will need to be filled in the regions of Côte-Nord and Nord-du-Québec between 2015 and 2019. Nearly **14** % of these jobs will be created as a result of business growth **(1,400 net new jobs)**, and more than **86** % will become available due to workers leaving on retirement **(8,700 jobs)**.

The employment rate will increase from **53.1**% in 2014 to **54.9**% in 2019, while the unemployment rate will decrease to reach **5.4**% in 2019.
